PROCEDURES FOR THE DRAWING OF LOTS MEN'S GYMNASTICS

<u>NOTE</u>: The drawing of lots for the semi-final and final sessions is very basic and is not covered in this document.

Preliminary comments

All steps in the draw will be conducted on the basis of a random draw.

From the Definitive Registration list, there are 52 federations with 2 or more gymnasts and 7 federations with 1 gymnast.

Based on these numbers and the certainty that many federations will not contest all of the competition slots available to them, it is possible to conduct the competition with two subdivisions and to draw up to a maximum of 10 federations (gymnasts) to each apparatus.

Conducting only two such subdivisions permits the draw to be conducted such that each federation with 2 or more gymnasts can have one of its gymnasts compete in each subdivision.

Draw Procedure for the Men's Qualifying Competition

Step 1 – draw of federations with 1 gymnast to subdivisions #1 or #2

- o Prepare two containers for the draw.
 - Place names of the 7 federations with 1 gymnast in container #1.
 - Place 4 subdivision 1 cards and 4 subdivision 2 cards in the container #2.
- o Draw one card from container #1.
- o Then, draw one card form container #2.
- o Continue the process until all 7 federations have been allocated to a subdivision.

Step 2 – draw of federations to subdivision #1

- o Prepare two containers for the draw.
 - $^{\circ}_{\circ}$ Place names of the 52 federations with 2 gymnasts in container #1.
 - Place names of the 3 or 4 federations with 1 gymnast that were drawn to subdivision #1 in step #1 into container #1.
 - Place 60 cards labeled FX 1 through HB 10 in container #2. The 10th spot will be available only on rings or vault in each subdivision depending on Step 1 results.
 - Place identical cards in container #3
- o Draw one card from container #1.

- o Then draw one card from container #2. This will identify the starting apparatus for that country in subdivision #1.
- o For federations with 2 or more gymnasts, draw one card from container #3. This will identify the starting apparatus for that country in subdivision #2.

<u>NOTE</u>: The FIG Men's Technical Committee has the right to make minor adjustments to the draw if the nominative registrations create organizational or scheduling problems.
