PROCEDURES FOR THE DRAWING OF LOTS FOR GYMNASTS

For the drawing of lots for gymnasts for the 2002 FIG WC, herewith are submitted the procedures that will be applied in accordance with the –

FIG Technical Regulations, Edition 2000:

- TR 4.4 Procedure for Drawing of Lots
- TR 5.1.9 Formation of Groups and Working Order
 - 5.1.9.3 Apparatus Finals (C-III)
- 5.2 Separate Apparatus World Championships for Individuals (Competition III)
- 5.2.1 Right of Participation and Size of Delegations

PROCEDURES

Qualification: Random Draw of Individual Gymnasts into 3 subdivisions

Step 1

Place names of all competing Federations in Draw Container #1 = 40 federations

Place Subdivision / Apparatus / Position Cards in Draw Container #2 = 76 cards

76 position cards must be on hand for the placement of the gymnasts into the 3 Subdivisions.

Example of position cards with designation of Subdivision / Apparatus / Position:

Subd 1 – VT 7

Subd 2 – UB 4

Subd 3 – BB 5

Subd 2 – FX 2

Step 2

Draw the Federation name card from Draw Container #1.

Draw the 1 or 2 Subdivision/ Apparatus / Position Cards from Draw Container #2 for each Federation's name drawn.

- Federations with 2 or more gymnasts entered are entitled to 2 slots; thus draw 2 cards from Draw Container #2.
 - It is possible for a federation with 2 slots to draw into the same Subdivision or different Subdivisions.
- Those Federations with 1 gymnast are entitled to draw only 1 card from Draw Container #2.

Subdivision 1 = 4 groups by apparatus, each with 7 gymnasts

Subdivisions 2 and 3 = 4 groups by apparatus, each with 6 gymnasts

(See attached Draw Table).

Apparatus Semi-Finals (C-III)

To establish the Working order on each apparatus, a draw is carried out from among the top 16 placed gymnasts in Qualification to fill the Start Positions from 1st through 16th.

(See attached Draw Table).

Apparatus Finals (C-III)

To establish the Working order on each apparatus, a draw is carried out from among the top 8 placed gymnasts in Semi-Finals fill the Start Positions from 1st through 8th.

(See attached Draw Table).

Podium Training will be organized into 29 groups comprising 6 subdivisions, as follows:

- federations with 4 gymnasts each form one group = 20 groups with 4 each = 80 gymnasts
 - federations with 2 gymnasts each, form one group = 7 groups with 2+2 each = 28 gymnasts
 - federations with 3+1+1 gymnast form one group = 2 groups with 3+1+1 gymnasts = 10 gymnasts
- Total > = 118 "**

Timing:

- 5 subdivisions with 4 groups of 4 gymnasts = 48 minutes each = 240 minutes
- 1 subdivision with 5 groups = 75 minutes
 - 3 groups with either 4 or 2+2 gymnasts and
 - 2 groups with 3+1+1 each, including 1 bye station

Total actual time for podium training, without breaks = 5:15 hours/minutes

Details for the 6 subdivisions with suggested start times and finish times to follow from WTC President.

Training Groups are worked out by the Organizing Committee per the **FIG TR 4.11.6** in consultation with the WTC President, taking into consideration the number of training halls, the location of the hotels and transport. It would be preferable to train in the same 29 groups by federation as for Podium Training.
